- o Mute the lead participant who is acting out a word, self-selected.

Boggle

- o Length: up to 5 minutes
- o Items Needed: 1 Piece of Paper & Pen
- o Guests write 1 letter on a piece of paper and hold up the paper for the duration of the game
- o Guests put words together using the letters guests are holding up and they write each word they think of in the chat
- o This works well when two people are participating from one home as one can hold up the letter and one can type their responses

Box of Lies

- o Invite each guest to come prepared with a box containing one random item from their home – the more random the item, the better.
- o Guest #1 explains in detail what is in the box without saying the name – they can either tell a lie or tell the truth.
- o Other participating guests should give a thumbs up or thumbs down sign if they think it is a truth or a lie, respectively..
- o Guests who got the answer right are the winners or they earn points for that round.
- o Rounds continue with other guests describing the items in their boxes.
